Module: Corporate governance for sustainability

Dr. Emilio Marti **Associate Professor**

"Corporate governance is key for sustainability as it describes the mechanisms through which companies are directed and controlled. We explore internal governance mechanisms by examining how top management teams, boards, and shareholders influence corporate sustainability. And we cover external governance mechanisms by analysing how rating agencies, non-governmental organizations, and regulators shape the way companies deal with environmental and social issues. Studying these interactions helps you understand how sustainability issues can become financially material over time."



Module: Tackling environmental issues Dr. Piero Morseletto **Academic Lecturer**

"We focus on six critical environmental issues: climate change, biodiversity loss, freshwater scarcity, habitat destruction, waste and pollution, and resource overexploitation. These were chosen for their severe impacts, increasing magnitude, and connection to business practices.

We will analyse each issue's anthropogenic origins, implications for nature and society, while analysing potential solutions. The course emphasizes real-world business examples to reinforce understanding. Students learn to comprehend short-term to longterm effects, from local to global scales, and develop solutions accordingly. The module also explores interconnections among these issues and synergies in addressing them, comparing studentdevised solutions with those implemented by companies worldwide."



Tackling social issues Dr. Corinna Frey-Heger **Associate Professor**

"Sustainability management is about addressing both environmental and social issues. In my course we will examine why social (and environmental issues) are so difficult to tackle, exploring their complexity, scale, and scope.

We will apply learnings and insights from previous courses, such as on systems thinking, to examine current approaches to tackling social or societal issues – and why they often fail –and critically explore organisation's role in intensifying social issues.

Ultimately, this course will help you understand why social issues cannot be tackled by blindly applying traditional management techniques and tools and enable you to develop sustainable solutions for social issues that take their complexity into account."

While you undertake this online master, your needs as a student and as a member of society are met in an innovative way. As a graduate, you will have learned various analytical strategies and can deal with responsibilities faced by corporations and businesses during global economic, social and environmental challenges.

The learning experience

Flexible, high-quality online learning

This MSc Sustainability Management programme is delivered through the online campus by RSM via Erasmus University Rotterdam.

We use a blended learning approach that comprises both live learning sessions and independent study. This blend empowers you to engage with the content and your peers in a manner that suits your individual circumstances, while still fostering a sense of community within your own cohort.

The programme follows a structured and logical sequence of modules that enhance overall focus and group cohesion, and it develops and maintains a strong cohort dynamic.

As a student, you can participate effectively regardless of your geographical location or time constraints, because of the flexibility provided with the diverse learning materials and formats.

Live sessions

Participate in real time and connect with peers and faculty.

Examples: live sessions with your teacher and peers, lectures, panel discussions, networking sessions, Q&A sessions, masterclasses.

Independent study

Get more flexibility than a traditional in-person programme. *Examples*: online materials such as recorded lectures, discussion forums, case studies, written assignments and essays, and online workbooks.

Virtual one-to-one sessions

Receive group and personal sessions with professors and study advisors.*

Examples: feedback and discussion sessions with your professors, reflection time to understand important aspects of the course, live sessions at the end of each module, and peer-to-peer discussions and exercises to prepare for the course assessment.

* The network you build during your studies will continue to support you after the programme has ended.



Cohort size

You and your cohort work together, ask questions, share you knowledge and learn closely with our top faculty and from each other.

This collaboration results in:

- » Ample interaction in the online classroom.
- » Close support from faculty members.
- » Detailed feedback during your studies.

Materials

- » All learning materials are in English and are hosted online.*
- » Study materials come directly from the RSM research community.
- » All classes are hosted by RSM faculty and research experts.
- * Some materials available up to 12 months after graduation.

Content

This programme's content deepens the knowledge and skills of professionals, like you, who aim to transform business strategies. Covering a range of theories and topics, our experienced faculty brings diverse perspectives and offers you a broad view of sustainability management. An international classroom

Interacting with your fellow students from all over the world is part of the experience in this online master. You and your cohort learn management skills that enable you to deal with global environmental and social issues, while you all simultaneously become a vibrant community of agents for positive change and sustainability around the world.

RSM's international online classroom gives you the opportunity to see things from a different perspective. For example, to learn how to solve problems in group settings through better understanding whether your own biases, personal beliefs, opinions, past experiences and/or cultural influences are hindering your learning process. We test and evaluate these through peer-to-peer feedback and through online discussions with the teaching staff and your peers.

MSc in Sustainability Management

Curriculum Overview

The online MSc Sustainability Management is a two-year programme consisting of six courses. You will study theoretical foundations of sustainability management, which will then be applied to solve real-world problems and obstacles.

At the end of your study, you will have to complete your final project, where you will apply the knowledge you gained during the programme to overcome a real challenge than an organisation is facing.

Year 1

Business and systems change

Your programme starts by building a platform for your learning journey and laying the foundations for impactful management.

Coursework includes:

- » Learning the principles of sustainability.
- » Exploring different worldviews of sustainable development and how those views may generate differentiated approaches and actions.
- » Analysing the current approaches of companies.
- » Evaluating how firms can use a systems perspective and innovation process to build business solutions that enhance the health of social-ecological systems.

Implementing sustainability strategies

In the second course, you step into the role of a sustainability manager.

This course focuses on:

- » Sustainability strategies that help to drive environmental and social impact within companies.
- » The key frameworks of sustainability management.
- » Practical tools and case studies that empower you to integrate sustainable practices into business operations.

Corporate governance for sustainability

In your third course, you explore the question:
Why are some companies more sustainable than others?

Coursework includes:

- » Analysing governance mechanisms that shape corporate sustainability.
- » Exploring the impact of internal governance mechanisms, such as top management teams, boards of directors, and shareholders.
- » Evaluating external governance mechanisms, such as ESG rating agencies, the media, social activists, and regulators.

Business ethics and responsible leadership

In the fourth course, you examine responsibility and ethics as pillars of sustainability.

You are stimulated to:

- » Develop the capabilities you need to help you avoid moral blind spots.
- » Internalise and embrace ethical behaviour in your daily work practices.
- » Lead other stakeholders within and beyond organisational boundaries to work towards sustainability objectives.



Year 2

Tackling social issues

The fifth course investigates the complexity of tackling social issues.

You learn how to:

- » Critically appraise potential solutions to social issues from various perspectives.
- » Explore why issues such as labour conditions, inequality or global migration are so difficult to tackle.
- » Reflect on the insights from the previous courses to examine the complexity, scale and scope of these issues, and why current solutions often fail.

Tackling environmental issues

In the sixth course, you explore how business activities drive major environmental issues, including:

- » Climate change
- » Biodiversity loss
- » Freshwater scarcity
- » Habitat destruction
- » Pollution
- » Overexploitation

For these issues, you further analyse the causes and impact, examine case studies to understand corporate responsibilities, risks, and strategies, and identify practical ways to address the challenges.

Final project

Your final project in the online MSc takes place in the last semester, around 16 weeks after you start, in which you are required to analyse a partner company's sustainability approach and to draw on insights from all the six courses.

For this project, you collect data, critically analyse the company's actions and write a detailed report. Additionally, you must demonstrate how you collaborated with a company contact and an RSM supervisor.



Studying online

Engaging online learning space

All our online learning materials are accessed through the virtual learning environment (VLE), Canvas, the world's number one teaching and learning software. Canvas is accessible via desktop, laptop and mobile devices.

Live sessions

Participate in real time and easily connect with peers and faculty. The live sessions include lectures, panel discussions, Q&A's and masterclasses.

Virtual one-to-one sessions

Receive group and personal sessions with professors and study advisors; for example, feedback, reflection time to understand important aspects of the course, and exercises to prepare for the course assessment.

Dedicated study advisors

Once you start the online MSc programme, you are paired with a study advisor who provides you with tailored support on topics such as study and time management, academic writing and navigating the virtual campus.

Online library

As an online student, you enjoy full access to the extensive online library of Erasmus University Rotterdam (EUR), one of the best academic libraries in the world. With this resource, you have access to a vast collection of e-books, academic journals, research databases and digital archives – just about everything you need to support your studies and enrich your learning experience. Admission and application

Are you eligible?

You are a change-maker and next-generation thinker who has worked in a broad range of industries. Your roles have been varied and you have operated in distinct geographies. You bring experience, expertise, insights and new ideas to your learning. For this online MSc study, you must demonstrate:

- » Academic excellence: a minimum level of an undergraduate university degree (Bachelor's degree).
- » Professional achievements: a minimum of three years' postgraduate work experience (can also be outside the Sustainability field).
- » English proficiency: a strong command of the English language (read, write, speak).
- » Leadership: experience in managing people and/ or projects.
- » Appreciation of diversity: you communicate effectively across cultures and value points of view that are different from your own.
- » Team skills: you share and use your own and others' expertise in small team tasks and classroom settings.
- » Communication skills: you can effectively convey your thoughts and ideas.

Our personal approach to admissions


As an online learner, from the moment you show interest in our programme, a dedicated team of admissions professionals are there to guide you through the process and provide you with a personalised experience.

Admissions process

To apply for this online programme, you will need to submit your application and supporting documents online. Normally the admissions process can take 4 – 6 weeks.

Requirements:

- » A minimum of three years of work experience. Work experience in Sustainability is not necessary. Pre-master courses are available, to support those of you who come from different fields and those who are new to sustainability.
- » A bachelor degree or higher or an undergraduate degree that is comparable in level with an academic bachelor degree obtained at a Dutch research university (WO).
- » A strong command of the English language (read, write, speak). If you are a non-native Englishspeaking student, you may be required to provide proof of your proficiency in the English language.

Application documents:

- 1. Motivation letter:
 Your motivation letter should include a
 paragraph about:
- » your individual motivations for studying
- » your suitability to study at the master level.
- » how you feel you can add value to your cohort and contribute as a student.
- 2. Your CV.
- 3. Education degree (i.e. university) and any relevant transcripts, in both the local language and an English translation.
- 4. A non-refundable application fee of € 20.
